1. Whether reporters of local newspapers may be allowed to see judgment?

Prayer in this petition filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. is for quashing of F.I.R. No.101 dated 21.8.2014 under Sections 406 and 420 read with Section 34 IPC and Section 24 of the Immigration Act, 1983 registered at Police Station Jathlana, District Yamuna Nagar (Annexure P-1) and all consequential proceedings arising therefrom on the basis of compromise dated 06.11.2014 (Annexure P-2).

This Court vide order dated June 09, 2015 had directed the parties to appear before the trial Court to get their statements recorded and the trial Court was directed to verify about the contents of said compromise and to submit its report.

Pursuant to the aforesaid order, the parties have appeared before

learned Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, Yamuna Nagar at Jagadhri and have got their statements recorded. On the basis of the statements so recorded by the parties, learned Magistrate has submitted his report dated 19.8.2015 to the effect that the parties have entered into compromise voluntarily with three free will and without any pressure and coercion and compromise is genuine.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Subhash Chand, does not dispute the factum of compromise.

In view of the above, no useful purpose would be served to continue with the proceedings before the trial Court in the instant F.I.R.

Following the principles laid down by the Full Bench judgment of this Court in *Kulwinder Singh and others Versus State of Punjab and another 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052* and approved by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in *Gian Singh Versus State of Punjab and others (2012) 10 SCC 303*, this petition is allowed and F.I.R. No.101 dated 21.8.2014 under Sections 406 and 420 read with Section 34 IPC and Section 24 of the Immigration Act, 1983 registered at Police Station Jathlana, District Yamuna Nagar (Annexure P-1) and all consequential proceedings arising therefrom is quashed, on the basis of compromise dated 06.11.2014 (Annexure P-2).
