Status report has been filed by learned State counsel by way of affidavit of Kishori Lal, Assistant Commissioner of Police, Gurgaon.

The instant petition has been filed for quashing FIR No.523 dated 30.09.2013 under Sections 498-A, 406, Police Station Sector-10, Gurgaon and the subsequent proceedings on the basis of written compromise arrived at between the parties.

Report from the trial Court has been received after

recording the statements of parties, alongwith original statements. It is reported that compromise is voluntary and without any coercion or undue influence.

Learned State counsel on instructions from ASI Bijender Singh submits that petitioners are the only accused in this FIR, which was recorded by respondent No.2 who is the only aggrieved person.

No useful purpose would be served in continuing the proceedings in this case in view of the compromise arrived at between them.

Following the principles laid down by the Full Bench judgement of this Court in **Kulwinder Singh and others v. State of Punjab and another, 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052 (P&H)** and approved by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and others, (2012)10 SCC 303**, this petition is allowed and FIR No.523 dated 30.09.2013 under Sections 498-A, 406, Police Station Sector-10, Gurgaon and the subsequent proceedings conducted on the basis thereof, are quashed.

Needless to say that parties shall remain bound by the terms of compromise and their statements.
