Petitioners have filed this petition under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No.42 dated 18.05.2015, under Sections 452, 323, 506, 148, 149 of Indian Penal Code, 1860, registered at Police Station Haryana, District Hoshiarpur.

Following order was passed by this Court on 10.07.2015:-

“The incident is said to have taken place on 16th May, 2015 whereas FIR was registered on 18th May, 2015. There is a cross version given by the petitioner.

The fact that the FIR was registered after a day would indicate some delay whether it is fatal to the case or not would be for the Trial Court to see and therefore this Court does not make any observation in this regard. The fact remains that the parties entered into a scuffle where the petitioner is attributed only

simple injuries. In the cross version registered at the behest of the side of the petitioner would also indicate some injuries suffered by them in the process.

Having regard to the aforesaid and particularly, noticing the fact that the matter was reported to the police after some delay, concession of interim bail is granted to the petitioner subject to the following conditions:-

i) that he shall make himself available for interrogation by a police officer as and when required;

ii) that he shall not directly or indirectly, make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any police officer;

iii) that he shall not leave India without the prior permission to the Court.

Adjourned to 3.9.2015.”

Learned State counsel who is assisted by Head Constable Tejinder Singh has submitted that petitioners have joined investigation and are not required for further investigation.

Accordingly, interim bail granted to the petitioners by this Court vide order dated 10.07.2015, is made absolute.

Petition stands disposed of accordingly.
