Prayer in the present petition filed under Section 438 CrPC is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.88 dated 8.4.2014 under Sections 323, 341, 506, 34 IPC and Section 295-A IPC (added subsequently) registered at Police Station Sultanwind, Amritsar.

This Court vide order dated 9.6.2015 has granted interim bail to the petitioner subject to the conditions, as laid down under Section 438(2) CrPC.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that pursuant to order dated 9.6.2015, the petitioner has joined the investigation.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Ravinder Pal Singh does not dispute the fact that the petitioner has joined investigation, however, submits that the *datar* has not been recovered.

Considering the nature of offence committed by the petitioner, the present petition is allowed and the order dated 9.6.2015 is made absolute.

However, the petitioner shall continue to join investigation as and when directed by the Investigating Officer and shall abide by the terms and conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) CrPC.
