Petitioner seeks regular bail under Section 439 Cr.P.C. in FIR No.92 dated 29.08.2013 for offences under Sections 302/307/341/148/149 of Indian Penal Code (IPC) and 27 of Arms Act, registered at Police Station Sadar Abohar, District Fazilka.

Earlier the petitioner moved CRM-M-8877-2014 and on 21.04.2014 the same was dismissed as withdrawn with liberty to the petitioner to file a fresh after recording of the statement of complainant-Manohar Lal. Subsequently petition bearing No.CRM-M-27393-2014 was filed, which was also dismissed as withdrawn with liberty to file a fresh after examination of some more witnesses vide order dated 30.09.2014.

Learned State counsel submits that there are four injured in the case out of which Sugriv (PW-4) and Mahi Ram (PW-5) including the complainant have since been examined and for other three namely Amar Singh, Budh Ram and Sham Lal the complainant has moved application before the trial Court for giving them up as won over.

I have heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and the State counsel.

The allegation against the petitioner is that he was armed with *Kappa* but no injury was attributed to him. He was named in the supplementary statement recorded by the complainant.

The petitioner is in custody since 08.09.2013.

In view of the above and without commenting on merits of the case, the petition is allowed and petitioner-Gurmeet Singh be released on bail subject to furnishing bail bonds and surety bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court.

It is, however, made clear that if the trial is delayed on the request made on behalf of the petitioner for cross-examining rest of the witnesses, the trial Court would immediately cancel his bail.
