By filing the present petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, the petitioner has sought regular bail in case FIR No.256, dated 08.04.2011, registered under Sections 302, 147, 148, 149, 216 of IPC, at Police Station Sadar, District Hisar.

The learned counsel for the petitioner does not press the present petition on its merit but prays to treat this petition for interim bail on account of the critical health of wife of the petitioner who met with an accident and is in the state of comma. The report with regard to this fact was obtained through the State. The report furnished by

Dr. Anil Goyal, Senior M.O., Medicity Hospital, reads as under:-

“Pt. is unconscious, (E2Vt M 3-4) on tracheosiom, on Rt feed Pt. has brain stem contusion with subarachnoid bleed. Pt. is likely to unconscious state for long time.”

The bail petition is being allowed solely on the ground that the wife of the petitioner is hospitalised being in a state of comma and is in a critical condition, therefore, the presence of the petitioner is required to attend to the needs of the patient. The petitioner is not involved in any other FIR. Accordingly, it is ordered that petitioner be released on interim bail for ten weeks to attend his wife, on his furnishing adequate bail/surety bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court. The petitioner shall surrender on the expiry of the stated period. The date of surrender is to be indicated by the releasing Court.

Keeping in view the fact that the FIR pertains to the year 2011, the trial court is directed to make an endeavour to conclude the trial expeditiously.

Disposed of accordingly.
