This petition has been filed for grant of regular bail to the petitioner in case bearing FIR No.115 dated 19.11.2014 registered at Police Station Mehna, District Moga for offences punishable under Section 394 read with Section 34 IPC.

Heard.

As per the allegation in the FIR two young boys robbed the complainant and his daughter's son and caused them injuries on 17.11.2014 when they were returning to their village and the occurrence took place near the Village Rauli.

Learned State counsel submits that the petitioners are also involved in two other cases. Challan in this case before the trial Court has been filed on 13.03.2015.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the petitioners are not named in the FIR and in other two cases registered against the

petitioners, they have already been allowed bail by the trial Court vide orders dated 16.05.2015 and 31.3.2015. Copies of the orders have been produced and taken on record.

In view of the fact that the completion of trial will take considerably long time and the petitioners are already on bail in the other cases registered against them, this petition is allowed. Petitioners are ordered to be released on regular bail on furnishing bail bond and surety bond to the satisfaction of the Trial Court/Duty Magistrate, Moga, subject to following terms:-

1. The petitioners shall comply with the conditions mentioned in Section 437(3) Cr.P.C.
2. In the event of their absence on any date of hearing, the benefit of bail allowed to the petitioners shall stand withdrawn. The trial Court shall be competent to cancel their bail bond and surety bond and proceed to procure their presence in accordance with law. In that eventuality the petitioners shall have to apply for bail afresh before the trial Court.
3. They shall not leave the country without previous permission of the Court.
