MAHESH GROVER, J

This is a petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C praying for quashing of FIR No. 30 dated 23.4.2012 registered under Sections 452, 324, 323,506 IPC at Police Station Nathana, District Bathinda and all consequent proceedings arising therefrom on the basis of a compromise.

On 21.1.2015, this Court had directed the Trial Court to record the statement of all the affected persons and further record a finding as to whether the compromise has been effected voluntarily by the parties.

That report has since been received alongwith copies of the statements of the affected persons which also indicates that the matter has been resolved amicably between the parties without any pressure from any quarter.

The Hon'ble Supreme Court in **Gold Quest International Private Ltd. vs. State of Tamil Nadu and others, 2014 (4) RCR (Crl.)**

206 has held that the disputes which are substantially matrimonial in nature,

or the civil property disputes with criminal facets, if the parties have entered into settlement, and it has become clear that there are no chances of conviction, there is no illegality in quashing the proceedings under Section 482 Cr.P.C read with Article 226 of the Constitution.

The Hon'ble Division Bench of this Court in **Sube Singh & anr. vs. State of Haryana & anr., 2013 (4) RCR (Crl) 102** has held that the High Court is vested with unparallel power to quash criminal proceedings at any stage to secure the ends of justice.

Having regard to the aforesaid and the observations made by the Full Bench of this Court in **Kulwinder Singh v. State of Punjab reported as 2007(3) Law Herald 2225** and of Hon'ble Supreme Court in **Gian Singh Vs. St. of Punjab** reported as 2012(4) RCR (Crl.) 543, instant petition is accepted. Consequently, FIR No. 30 dated 23.4.2012 registered under Sections 452, 324, 323,506 IPC at Police Station Nathana, District Bathinda and all consequent proceedings arising therefrom qua all the petitioners herein are hereby quashed.
