Instant petition has been filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C. for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.10 dated 13.03.2014 (alleged to be wrongly mentioned as 10.03.2014 in the impugned order), under Sections 406, 498-A and 109 of the Indian Penal Code, registered at Police Station Qadian Police District Batala, District Gurdaspur.

Heard learned counsel for the parties.

Vide order dated 18.06.2014, a Coordinate Bench of this Court directed that in the event of arrest, the petitioner would be released on interim bail to the satisfaction of the Arresting/Investigating Officer in connection with above-said case FIR.

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Vide order dated 11.08.2014, parties were directed to appear before the Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court on 20.08.2014 for amicable settlement, however, mediation failed. On 16.01.2015, matter was again referred to Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court for amicable settlement.

In pursuance of order dated 16.01.2015, parties appeared before Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court and as per the report of Mediator, parties have settled the dispute by way of compromise.

Learned counsel for the parties state that parties will file petition under Section 13-B of Hindu Marriage Act within 15 days and also settle other matters.

On instructions from the investigating officer, learned State counsel informs that the petitioner has joined the investigation.

Having considered the facts and circumstances of the case, order dated 18.06.2014 passed by the Coordinate Bench of this Court is made absolute.

Present petition is disposed of accordingly.

Parties shall abide by the terms and conditions of the settlement arrived at between them before the Mediator and if any party is aggrieved, the same can approach this Court.
