HARI PAL VERMA, J. (ORAL)

Pursuant to order dated 21.9.2015, learned State counsel has produced the medical examination report of injured Gaurav, which is taken on record.

As per report dated 1.10.2015, the medical examination of injured Gaurav was conducted by a Board of four doctors of the General Hospital, Gurgaon. The relevant part of the medical examination report reads as under:

“On examination:- Patient was lying on the stretcher, urine passed in clothes, spontaneous eye opening is there. There is no response to verbal or painful stimuli. GCS (Glassgo

Coma Scale) – E4V2M1 = 7/15, BP – 120/80, PR – 80 per minute. Chest bilateral clear. CVS S1S2 normal. There was hypertonia of the whole body with exaggerated reflexes.

In our opinion patient is opening eye spontaneously but not oriented to time, place and person. There was no response to verbal commands and patient is not able to speak and communicate.”

In view of the above report, no case for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners is made out.

Accordingly, the interim relief granted to the petitioners stands vacated and the present petition is dismissed.
