Petitioners, who are stated to be major, claim that they have married against the wishes of their parents on 14.1.2015. The photographs of the marriage have been placed on file as Annexure-P-4. The photocopies of Matriculation Examination Certificates, showing the date of birth of both the petitioners, have been placed on file as Annexures-P-1 and P-2. The marriage certificate has been placed on record as Annexure-P-3.

It is claimed that the petitioners have moved an application 15.1.2015 (Annexure-P-5) before the Senior Superintendent of Police, Tarn Taran, for protecting their life and liberty as they apprehend danger to their life from the private respondents.

In these circumstances, petition is disposed of with a direction to the Senior Superintendent of Police, Tarn Taran, to consider the application of the petitioners 15.1.2015 (Annexure-P-5) and assess the threat perception to the life and liberty of the petitioners and if it is found that there is danger to the life of the petitioners, necessary steps be taken to protect the life and liberty of the petitioners.

However, it is made clear that this order shall not be taken to be the proof of valid marriage.

Disposed of accordingly.
