Prayer in this petition is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.44 dated 6.6.2014 under Sections 498-A and 406 IPC, registered at Police Station Begowal, District Kapurthala.

This Court vide order dated 10.3.2015 has granted interim bail to the petitioner with a further direction to join the investigation as and when required by the investigating officer and to comply with the provisions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that by virtue of the order dated 10.3.2015 passed by this Court, the petitioner has been granted

ad-interim bail. He further submits that the police has submitted the Challan as provided under Section 173 Cr.PC and even the charge has been framed by the trial Court against the petitioner.

Since the petitioner has already furnished bail bonds, in the light of order dated 10.3.2015, no further indulgence of this Court is required at this stage.

The present petition is accordingly disposed of as such.
