The petitioners are 13 in number. They seek quashing of FIR No.93 dated 10.06.2012 under Sections 307/427/148/149 IPC and 25/27 Arms Act registered at Police Station Shimla Puri, Ludhiana at the instant of respondent No.3 Beant Singh alleging that the petitioners constituted an unlawful assembly and attacked the complainant and one Ricky Bhawar, respondent No.2 armed with various weapons. Quashing has been sought on the basis of compromise.

Parties were directed to appear before the Illaqa Magistrate to get their statements recorded. After recording the statements of the complaint and the injured, a report has been

sent by the said Court that the matter has been compromised amicably without any threat, coercion or undue influence. It appears that none of the petitioners is proclaimed offender. All the effective parties have entered into the compromise.

Counsel for the respondent No.2, injured had stated at bar on the instruction of respondent No.2 that he had not suffered any fire arm injury and that offence under Section 307 IPC has been deleted during the investigation.

Following the judgment of Full Bench of this Court in **Kulwinder Singh and others Vs. State of Punjab, 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal)**, I am of the opinion that no useful purpose will be served by continuing with the criminal proceedings, when the parties have entered into a compromise in a case where there is no grievous injury attributed to any of the petitioners.

Petition is allowed. The abovesaid FIR and all the criminal proceedings emanating therefrom are hereby quashed on the basis of compromise, subject to a condition that all the petitioners will deposit a total sum of Rs.10,000/- with Punjab State Legal Services Authority, Sector-22, Chandigarh and another total sum of Rs.10,000/- with Punjab Police Welfare Fund, Sector-9, Chandigarh within a period of one month.
