RAJ MOHAN SINGH, J. (Oral)

Petitioners have filed this petition under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for issuance of directions to official respondents to protect their life and liberty from the hands of private respondents.

Petitioners claim themselves to be major and have solemnized marriage against the wishes of their parents on 28.06.2015. Factum of marriage has been pleaded with reference to marriage certificate and photographs (Annexures P-5 and P-6 respectively).

Petitioners have shown apprehension in respect of their life, liberty and property at the hands of respondents No.5 and 6 who

are the parents of girl.

Learned counsel for the petitioners states that petitioners could not file any representation before respondent No.3 as they are run away couple and were not in a position to approach the Police Authorities because father of petitioner No.1 is a property dealer having proximity with high-ups in Police Administration.

Be that as it may, let this petition itself be considered to be a representation on behalf of petitioners. Petitioners may approach respondent No.3-Superintendent of Police, Yamuna Nagar with this petition.

In case such a course is adopted respondent No.3-Superintendent of Police, Yamuna Nagar would be obligated to look into the grievance of the petitioners and devise his own mechanism in order to extract veracity in the allegations made in the petition. If need be respondent No.3 may pass appropriate order in the context of protection of life, liberty and property of the petitioner.

Petition stands disposed of in the above terms.
