Prayer in this petition is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in a complaint case titled “Punjab Pollution Control Board Versus Primary Health Centre, Attari, Amritsar and others”. The said complaint has been filed by the Assistant Environmental Engineer, Punjab Pollution Control Board, Regional Officer, Plot No.164, Focal Point, Mehta Road, Amritsar.

Learned counsel for the State, on instructions from Tejinder

Kumar, Assistant Environmental Engineer, states that a complaint under Sections 15 and 17 of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 for violation of the provisions of Bio Medical Waste (Management and Handling) Rules, 1998 was filed against the petitioner. However, he further submits that now the petitioner has undertaken to comply with the environment provisions.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that pursuant to order dated July 02, 2015 of this Court, the petitioner had appeared before the trial Court where she has been admitted on interim bail.

Taking into consideration the statement of learned counsel for the State that the petitioner has started complying with the environment provisions coupled with the fact that she has appeared before the trial Court, interim order dated 2.7.2015 passed by this Court is made absolute.

It is made clear that the observations made hereinabove shall not be construed as reflection of any opinion on the merits of the main case and the trial Court shall decide the case on the basis of availability of evidence.
