RAMESHWAR SINGH MALIK, J. (Oral)

Learned counsel for the State, while referring to para 2 of the preliminary submissions of the reply filed on behalf of respondent No.5, submits that no application was made to the police. Neither the petitioner nor the private respondents were found involved in any criminal case nor they are required by any investigating agency. She further submits that after a detailed enquiry, no threat perception was found to be existing as wrongly alleged by the petitioner. She concluded by submitting that present petition may be disposed of.

Having heard the learned counsel for the State and after careful perusal of the record of the case, instant petition is disposed of, with a direction to the Senior Superintendent of Police (Rural), Amritsar- respondent No.3 that if the petitioner approaches him by moving an appropriate representation raising any threat perception, he shall consider and decide the same at an early date, by passing an appropriate order thereon, strictly in accordance with law so as to ensure that no harm is caused to the life and liberty of the petitioner.

With the above-said observations made and directions issued, the instant petition stands disposed of.
