FATEH DEEP SINGH, J. (ORAL)

Report dated 29.07.2015 of learned Judicial Magistrate 1st

Class, Gurdaspur has been received whereby after recording statements of complainant wife Jaspinder Kaur and the accused persons namely Gurpreet Singh, Harpreet Singh, Gurmej Singh and Kashmir Kaur, the Court has shown its satisfaction that the compromise has been arrived at voluntarily, out of free will of the parties, without any undue influence, coercion or pressure.

Heard.

In the light of the satisfaction shown by the Court, being a pure matrimonial dispute, together with the fact that compromise will go a long way in ironing out differences for betterment of future life of the parties and in view of the law laid down in '**Gian Singh v. State of Punjab and another**' 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and '**Kulwinder Singh and others v. State of Punjab and another**' 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of FIR No.138 dated 01.11.2013 registered at Police Station Ghuman Kalan, District Gurdaspur under Section 498A IPC and all consequences arising out of the said FIR are quashed.

The petition stands allowed in those terms.
