RAMESHWAR SINGH MALIK, J. (ORAL)

Petitioner, by way of instant petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C., seeks direction to the respondent authorities to provide a safe passage, so as to enable him to come to India and then seek appropriate remedy in accordance with law, including the concession of anticipatory bail in FIR No.38 dated 04.03.2015 under Sections 420/506 IPC, registered at Police Station Dharamkot, District Moga.

Notice of motion was issued.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that in compliance of the orders passed by this Court, petitioner has also deposited an amount of Rs.5 lacs which is the total disputed amount with the Registry of this Court. He further submits that petitioner is seeking only a limited relief so that he can come to India and participate in the criminal proceedings arising out of the abovesaid FIR.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and after careful perusal of the record of the case, this Court is of the considered opinion that since the petitioner has already shown his bonafide by depositing the entire amount in question i.e. Rs.5 lacs, he deserves to be granted the limited relief which he is praying for, in the present petition.

In view of the above, instant petition is disposed of, with a direction that petitioner shall not be arrested for a period of three weeks from today in FIR No.38 dated 04.03.2015 under Sections 420/506 IPC, registered at Police Station Dharamkot, District Moga to enable him to seek the appropriate relief in accordance with law, including the anticipatory bail.

Disposed of, accordingly.
