Prayer in this petition filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. is for quashing of FIR No. 47, dated 22.04.2015 (Annexure P-1), for offence under Sections 420, 465, 467, 468, 471 and 120-B IPC, registered at Police Station, Cantt, District Ferozepur, and all other subsequent proceedings arising therefrom, on the basis of compromise dated 16.05.2015 (Annexure P-2).

This Court vide order dated 03.07.2015, had directed the parties to appear before the Area Magistrate/trial Court to get their statements recorded and the Area Magistrate/trial Court was further directed to submit its report about the genuineness of the compromise, as per the statements of the parties so recorded.

Accordingly, the parties have appeared before learned Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Ferozepur, and got their statements recorded. On the basis of the statements so recorded by the parties, learned Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Ferozepur, has submitted his report dated 06.08.2015, to the effect that the compromise entered between the parties is genuine, voluntary and the same has been effected without any coercion and undue influence.

Learned State counsel does not dispute the factum of compromise.

In view of the above, no useful purpose would be served to continue with the proceedings before the trial Court in the instant FIR *qua* the petitioners.

Accordingly, following the principles laid down by the Full Bench judgment of this Court in **Kulwinder Singh and others v. State of Punjab and another**, 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052 (P&H) and approved by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **Gian Singh vs. State of Punjab and others**, (2012)10 SCC 303, this petition is allowed and FIR No. 47, dated 22.04.2015 (Annexure P-1), for offence under Sections 420, 465, 467, 468, 471 and 120-B IPC, registered at Police Station, Cantt, District Ferozepur, and all other subsequent proceedings arising therefrom, on the basis of compromise dated 16.05.2015 (Annexure P-2), are hereby quashed.
