

**SURINDER SINGH AND ANR VS SENIOR SUPERINTENDENT OF
POLICE CHD AND ORS**

for the petitioner (s).

The petitioners are seeking three reliefs in this petition:-

Firstly, respondents No.1 to 4 be directed to investigate the complaint filed by them Annexure P-30 which does not bear any date.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that this complaint was sent by post to the Senior Superintendent of Police, Chandigarh and he will place on record the postal receipt.

The second relief sought is for issuance of direction to respondent No.2 that respondent No.11, who has been declared as proclaimed offender, be arrested.

It is submitted that respondent No.11 has been declared proclaimed offender in some complaint filed by respondent No.5 Bikramjit Singh.

The petitioners have no locus standi in the complaint filed by respondent No.5, as such, this relief can not be allowed. The petition qua this relief is dismissed. However the police is bound by the legal duty, has to perform to arrest a proclaimed offender.

The third relief sought by the petitioner is that he should not be called in the complaint filed by respondent No.10 or any other complaint filed by respondents No.5 to 10 in the matter of cheating, fraud committed by respondent No.11 with them. This relief is also declined, as complainant, on one hand wants his complaint to be enquired and at the same time seeks

the remedy that no action be taken on complaint filed by respondent No.10 or respondent Nos.5 to 10.

Learned counsel for the petitioners further submits that he does not have any copy of complaint filed by respondent No.10 or respondents No.5 to 10. The petitioners are only getting threats of the complaint being filed against them.

Let the postal receipt of sending the complaint Annexure P-30 be placed on file and put up on 24.07.2015.

Any other document the petitioners want to place on record, they may file the same before the next date.
