I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner.

Perusal of the record indicates that the petitioner had facilitated transfer of the land by impersonation in connivance with co-accused Dharminder Singh.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that Dharminder Singh co-accused has been granted pre-arrest bail.

It is apparent that Dharminder Singh was not present at the time of execution of sale deed by impersonator. The case of the petitioner is distinguishable from that of Dharminder Singh.

No ground is made out to grant pre-arrest bail to the petitioner.

Petition is dismissed.

At this stage, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that there are chances of amicably resolving the controversy by cancellation of the sale deed.

In case, the matter is compromised, it will be open to the petitioner to approach this Court again for grant of pre-arrest bail.
