FATEH DEEP SINGH, J. (ORAL)

Report dated 04.08.2015 of learned Judicial Magistrate 1st

Class, Gurdaspur has been received whereby after recording statements of Shamsheer Singh and Baljit Singh from the complainant side and that of the accused persons namely Malkit Singh, Harnit Kaur and Lakhwinder Kaur, the Court has shown its satisfaction that the compromise has been arrived at voluntarily, out of free will of the parties, without any undue influence, coercion or pressure.

Heard.

In the light of the satisfaction shown by the Court, the fact that parties are co-villagers and the offences for which the accused has been hauled up are not of serious nature, together with the fact that compromise will go a long way in ironing out differences for betterment of future life of the parties and in view of the law laid down in '**Gian Singh v. State of Punjab and another**' 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and '**Kulwinder Singh and others v. State of Punjab and another**' 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of FIR No.23 dated 19.02.2012 registered at Police Station Ghuman Kalan, District Gurdaspur under Sections 324/326/427/34 IPC and all consequences arising out of the said FIR are quashed.

The petition stands allowed in those terms.
