Quashing of the FIR No.510 dated 21.12.2013 under Sections 406, 420, 506, 120-B of IPC, registered at Police Station Sector 11, Chandigarh (Annexure P/1) and its consequential proceedings on the basis of compromise dated 19.02.2014 (Annexure P/2), is being sought.

The dispute pertains to 5 marla residential-cum-diary plot measuring about 143 sq. yds. bearing plot No.175, Milk Colony, Dhanas, UT Chandigarh.

During the stage of investigation itself, the matter has been compromised by the complainant and the petitioners, vide Annexure P/2.

In compliance of the order dated 09.09.2014, status report has been received from the Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, Chandigarh. A joint statement of Paramjit Kaur (complainant/respondent No.2) and Dinesh Kumar (petitioner No.1) has been recorded on 04.02.2015 to the effect that they have compromised the matter, vide Ex.PA in the Court of Ms. Shilpi

Gupta, CJ (JD), Chandigarh in Civil Suit No.691 of 2013 titled as Dinesh Kumar Vs. Paramjit Kaur & anr. and the petitioner has transfer the title of the house No.175, Milk Colony, Dhanas, Chandigarh and undertook to further cooperate without any demand either in cash or otherwise as per the compromise deed dated 19.02.2014. They have no objection if the present FIR is quashed. Accused No.2 wife of Dinesh Kumar was unable to attend the proceedings. The statement of Dinesh Kumar has been recorded on behalf of his wife as well.

Consequently, in view of the status report and in view of the judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the case of **Madan Mohan Abbot vs. State of Punjab 2008(2) RCR (Criminal) 429**, the law laid down by the Full Bench of this Court in the case of **Kulwinder Singh and Ors. vs. State of Punjab and another 2007(3) RCR (Crl.) 1052**, no useful purpose would be served in prolonging the litigation.

Accordingly, FIR No.510 dated 21.12.2013 under Sections 406, 420, 506, 120-B of IPC, registered at Police Station Sector 11, Chandigarh (Annexure P/1), is quashed with all consequential proceedings arising therefrom qua petitioners.

The petition stands disposed of qua petitioners.
