FATEH DEEP SINGH, J. (ORAL)

Report dated 03.09.2015 of learned Sub Divisional Judicial Magistrate, Dera Bassi has been received whereby after recording statements of complainant Karan Kumar, injured Sahil and Sanjeev as well as the accused persons namely Ajay Kumar, Narinder Kumar, Suraj Parkash, Mukesh Kumar and Yudhvair, the Court has shown its satisfaction that the compromise has been arrived at voluntarily, out of free will of the parties, without any undue influence, coercion or pressure.

Heard.

In the light of the satisfaction shown by the Court, being a case of version and cross-version, the fact that parties belong to the same very village and the offences for which the accused have been hauled up are not of serious nature, together with the fact that compromise will go a long way in ironing out differences for betterment of future life of the parties and in view of the law laid down in '**Gian Singh v. State of Punjab and another**' 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and '**Kulwinder Singh and others v. State of Punjab and another**' 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of FIR No.284 dated 29.11.2014 registered at Police Station Dera Bassi under Sections 323/324/326/506/148/149 IPC and all consequences arising out of the said FIR qua petitioners are quashed.

The petition stands allowed in those terms.
