Petitioner, by way of instant petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C., seeks appropriate directions to the official respondents to enquire into the matter and proceed in accordance with law against respondent No.4.

Notice of motion was issued and pursuant thereto, reply was filed.

Learned counsel for the State submits that matter has been thoroughly enquired into by a Special Investigation Team constituted for the said purpose. However, allegations levelled by the petitioner were not found substantiated and the matter was filed, rendering the present petition as infructuous.

Faced with the above, learned counsel for the petitioner also fairly states that let the present petition be disposed of, in view of the statement made by learned counsel for the State but liberty may be granted to the petitioner to avail his other remedies, in accordance with law.
