SNEH PRASHAR, J.

By way of both the petitions filed under Sections 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, the petitioners are seeking anticipatory bail in case FIR No.58 dated 24.6.2014, registered under Sections 498-A, 406 of the Indian Penal Code at Police Station Balongi, District SAS Nagar, Mohali.

The petitioners are stated to be parents-in-law and husband.

During the pendency of the petitions, the parties were directed to appear before the Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court and as per the report dated 2.2.2015 received from there, the parties have settled all

the disputes and have arrived at a settlement. A written compromise deed has been drawn accordingly to which, the parties had agreed to file a divorce petition under section 13-B of the Hindu Marriage Act for decree of divorce by mutual consent.

In terms of the settlement, the parties stated to have already filed a petition under Section 13-B of the HMA and their first motion statements have been recorded.

In view of said facts and circumstances and the compromise arrived at between the parties, both the petitions are allowed. In the event of arrest, the petitioners shall be released on bail by the Arresting Officer subject to the following conditions:

- 1) that they shall make themselves available for interrogation by a police officer as and when required;
- 2) that they shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any police officer and;
- 3) that they shall not leave India without the previous permission of the Court.

However, it is made clear that both the parties will abide by the terms and conditions of the compromise.
