Petitioners seek pre-arrest bail in FIR No.41 dated 25.6.2015 registered under Sections 306 and 34 IPC at Police Station, GRP, Sangrur.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that there was no occasion with the petitioners to cause any kind of harassment to the deceased. The allegations against the petitioners are false and baseless. He further submits that the petitioners brought along with them Rani wife of the deceased because she was in the family way at that point of time. He also places reliance on an order dated 15.7.2015 passed by this Court in CRM-M-22708-2015 (Kinta v. State of Punjab), to contend that petitioners are similarly placed and are also entitled for concession of anticipatory bail. He prays for allowing the present petition.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioners at considerable length, after careful perusal of the record of the case and giving thoughtful consideration to the contentions raised, this Court is of the considered opinion that keeping in view the peculiar fact situation of the case, petitioners have not been found entitled for the concession of anticipatory bail. It is so said because the case of the petitioners is clearly distinguishable from their co-accused Kinta, as she was staying at Chandigarh. Allegations against the petitioners are direct and specific.

In view of the above and without commenting anything further on merits, at this stage, this Court is of the considered view that custodial interrogation of the petitioners would be a compulsive necessity of the investigating agency so as to carry out an effective investigation. No case for anticipatory bail is made out.

Dismissed.
