The prayer made in the instant petition is to direct respondents No.2 and 3 for taking action on the application of petitioner (Annexure P-1) and further directing respondents No.2 and 3 to take legal action against respondents No.4 to 9 and protect the life and liberty of the petitioner.

The status report by way of affidavit of Balwinder Singh Sekhon, Deputy Superintendent of Police, City Ferozepur, has been filed.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that there was

only one FIR before the instant petition was filed i.e. FIR No.218 dated 23.10.2006 under Section 382, 506 IPC and Sections 25, 27 of Arms Act, Police Station Zira in which he has been acquitted. Learned counsel further submits that all the remaining four FIRs were registered after filing of the instant petition. The petitioner's counsel also submits that these subsequent FIRs were relating to recovery of small quantity of intoxicant and those recoveries have been planted on him after filing of the instant petition.

Learned State counsel on instructions from ASI Major Singh submits that after FIR No.169 dated 01.06.2014, Police Station Sadar, Ferozepur, there is no subsequent FIR registered against him.

In view of the aforesaid circumstances, no further indulgence of this court is required.

The instant petition is disposed of with liberty to the petitioner to move comprehensive representation, if required, within one month to the SSP, Ferozepur and on filing such a representation respondent No.2 would look into the same and take appropriate steps, if required in accordance with law.
