Petitioner, by way of instant petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C., seeks direction for transfer of the investigation to some independent agency like the Central Bureau of Investigation-respondent No.2 qua FIR No.187 dated 10.9.2013 registered under Section 365 IPC at Police Station, Sector-19, Chandigarh.

Learned senior counsel for the petitioner submits that despite sincere efforts having been made on behalf of the petitioner, police authorities of Chandigarh Administration are not either informing the petitioner nor any effective investigation is being conducted. Whereabouts of brother of the petitioner are not known for the last more than 1½ years. He next contended that petitioner approached the Senior Superintendent of Police, Chandigarh, vide representation dated 8.4.2015 (Annexure P-4) but no action thereon has been taken. He concluded by submitting that for the time being, petitioner will be satisfied in case the Senior Superintendent of Police, Chandigarh, is directed to monitor the progress of the case closely and ensure taking the matter to its logical end, at an early date, by taking appropriate action, in accordance with law.

Having heard the learned senior counsel for the petitioner and without expressing any opinion on the merits of case, lest it should prejudice the rights of either of the parties, the Senior Superintendent of Police, Chandigarh is directed to look into the matter, consider the grievance of the petitioner raised in his representation dated 8.4.2015 (Annexure P-4) and take immediate appropriate action, in accordance with law. He is further directed to monitor the progress of the case and ensure that effective investigation is conducted and concluded at an early date. The Senior Superintendent of Police, Chandigarh is also directed that he shall apprise the petitioner also about the progress of the case orally, if written intimation is not deemed appropriate in the circumstances of the case.

With the above-said observations made and directions issued, the present petition stands disposed of.
