RAMESHWAR SINGH MALIK J.(ORAL):

Learned counsel for the State submits that the complaint lodged by the complainant was considered and the matter was enquired into, but petitioner was found involved in as many as 21 cases, including numerous NDPS matters. She further submits that petitioner has submitted before the enquiry officer that she does not intend to pursue her complaint any further.
