Learned State counsel has placed on file the copy of the FIR No.85, dated 04.12.2014, under Sections 302 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860, registered at Police Station Nurmahal, District Jalandhar City, showing that the FIR has been registered in this case.

This Court vide order dated 12.05.2014 directed the Inspector General of Police (Crimes) to investigate the matter and submit his report. Therefore, it is directed that as per direction contained in the order dated 12.05.2014, the investigation of the FIR shall be carried out by the Crime Branch (Punjab) and completed

within 90 days from the receipt of the copy of this order. The investigation shall be handed over to an experienced officer, who shall take into account all material aspects before him to conclude as to what offence was committed and if so, by whom the same was committed and submit the final report to the trial Court.

However, the petitioner is given liberty that if he is not satisfied with the investigation of Crime Branch, he can move before this Court again.

The present petition is disposed of accordingly.
