Prayer in this petition filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. is for quashing of FIR No.206 dated 31.5.2009 under Sections 452, 325, 506 and 34 IPC registered at Police Station Sadar Sonapat (Annexure P-1) along with all other consequential proceedings arising therefrom on the basis of compromise dated 3.5.2013 (Annexure P-3).

This Court vide order dated 3.9.2014 had passed the following order:-

"List again on 23.04.2015.

In the meantime, parties are directed to appear before the Appellate Court and the Appellate

Court, after recording statements of the complainant/victims, shall send its report qua the genuineness of the compromise along with copies of the statements.”

Pursuant to aforesaid order dated 22.1.2015, the parties have appeared before learned Additional Sessions Judge, Sonapat and have got their statements recorded. On the basis of the statements so recorded, learned Additional Sessions Judge has forwarded his report dated 27.1.2015 to the effect that the compromise entered between the parties is genuine and the same has been effected voluntarily without any force and pressure.

In view of the above, no useful purpose would be served to continue with the proceedings before the trial Court in the instant FIR.

Following the principles laid down by the Full Bench judgment of this Court in **Kulwinder Singh and others v. State of Punjab and another**, 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052 (P&H) and approved by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **Gian Singh vs. State of Punjab and others**, (2012)10 SCC 303, this petition is allowed and FIR No.206 dated 31.5.2009 under Sections 452, 325, 506 and 34 IPC registered at Police Station Sadar Sonapat (Annexure P-1) along with all other consequential proceedings arising therefrom are quashed on the basis of compromise dated 3.5.2013 (Annexure P-3).
