Petitioner-Ashu Mittal has filed the present petition under Section 438 Code of Criminal Procedure for grant of anticipatory bail in the present case on the ground that the entire allegations against the petitioner are that it was a case of accumulation of huge profit and not a case of forgery of any document or involved in any corruption matter. Moreover, he will join the investigation. So he be released anticipatory bail.

Learned State counsel took the plea that in fact the present case involves conspiracy of creating false e-mail ID of Government Department and thereafter letters No.2372 and 2374 were forged and in place of publication of notice for tender publication. The contents of the same were substituted and the publication be effected in the area of Gurdaspur and Barnala. This was only with the purpose to supply the materials at highly increased rates and to earn huge profits as well as to grab the publication funds. The two firms are M/s Mittal Traders, Sangrur and M/s Sangrur

Quality Printers. Both the firms belong to the same family and present applicant is one of the family member. Custodial investigation of the petitioner is required as to know the role pertaining to him. So bail application be dismissed.

Keeping in view the fact that custodial investigation of the petitioner is required so as to complete the investigation by any petitioner and to know the modus operandi of forging of e-mail ID and letters of the government department. It is not a case of release of petitioner in anticipatory bail and present application for anticipatory bail of the applicant-Ashu Mittal stand dismissed.
