The present petition has been filed under Section 439 Cr.P.C. seeking regular bail to the petitioner-Vikram Singh alias Vicky in case FIR no.97, dated 19.02.2015, under Sections 420, 406, 467, 468, 471 and 120-B IPC, registered at Police Station, City Jagadhri, District-Yamun Nagar.

Learned counsel for the parties have been heard.

FIR in question was registered on the statement of complainants, namely, Suresh Pal and Sanjay Kumar. It was stated that the complainants are the relatives and were wanted to purchase some land. In such circumstances, they came in contact with one Vikram Singh alias Vicky son of Mehma Singh, accused/petitioner herein. Thereafter, Vikram Singh alias Vicky (present petitioner) along with his co-accused Ramesh Kumar alias Bhura son of Hari Ram,

together showed land measuring 63 kanals in village Salempur to the complainants. The allegation in the FIR is that they disclosed the complainants that the real owner of the said land was Tejinder Singh and co-accused, namely, Amar Singh @ Kala had impersonated himself as Tejinder Singh and thereby taken a total sum of ₹65 lacs on two occasions i.e. ₹21 lacs initially and ₹44 lacs thereafter on 23.09.2013.

The present petitioner is alleged to be a part and parcel of such conspiracy and in having committed the fraud on the complainants.

It has also gone uncontroverted that the present petitioner had issued a cheque bearing No.000024, dated 30.04.2014, drawn on HDFC Bank for a sum of ₹20 lacs to the complainants towards part refund of the money that the complainants had paid. Such cheque is stated to have been dishonoured on account of insufficient funds in the account of the present petitioner.

Learned State counsel upon instructions from ASI-Kushal Pal has also apprised the Court that the petitioner is a habitual offender and is involved in a number of other criminal proceedings and details of which are as follows:-

(i) FIR No. 217/2015, under Sections 420, 467, 468 and 471 IPC, registered at Police Station, City, Yamuna Nagar.

(ii) FIR No. 448/2014, under Sections 420, 467, 468 and 471 IPC, registered at Police Station, Civil Lines, Karnal.

(iii) FIR No. 14/2015, under Sections 420, 467, 468 and 471 IPC, registered at Police Station, Thanesar, Kurukshetra.

(iv) FIR No. 157/2014, under Sections 420, 467, 468 and 471 IPC, registered at Police Station, Ladwa, Kurukshetra.

In the totality of the facts and circumstances of the case and keeping in view the serious allegations, this Court is of the considered view that the petitioner is not entitled to the concession of regular bail.

Accordingly, the present petition is dismissed.
