RAMESHWAR SINGH MALIK, J. (ORAL)

Petitioner seeks bail pending trial in FIR No.53 dated 16.04.2015 under Sections 420, 120-B IPC, registered at Police Station Lambi, District Sri Muktsar Sahib.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that petitioner has been doing the work as a labourer. In this view of the matter, the allegations levelled against the petitioner are factually incorrect and does not appeal to reason. He prays for allowing the present petition.

On the other hand, learned counsel for the State, on instructions from HC Parulan Singh, Police Station Lambi, District Sri Muktsar Sahib, submits that petitioner was one of the accused in the present case. His participation in the commission of crime has been duly established during investigation. He prays for dismissal of the present petition.

Having heard the learned counsel for the parties at considerable length, after careful perusal of the record of the case and giving thoughtful

consideration to the contentions raised, this Court is of the considered opinion that in the given fact situation of the case, petitioner has been found entitled for bail pending trial. It is so said because of the material fact that the petitioner was doing the work as labourer, has not been denied. In this view of the matter, the kind of allegations levelled against the petitioner prima facie seems to be improbable. However, he shall face the criminal trial.

In view of the above and without commenting anything further on merits at this stage, lest it should prejudice the rights of either of the parties, instant petition is allowed. Petitioner is directed to be released on bail pending trial on his furnishing adequate bail bonds/surety bonds to the satisfaction of learned trial Court.

Disposed of, accordingly.
