This order shall dispose of all the four petitions.

For the sake of convenience the facts are being taken up
from CRM-M No.29824 of 2011.

Prayer in this petition, filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C., is for
quashing of order dated 16.6.2011 (Annexure P-2) passed by Sub
Divisional Magistrate, Barnala, who while exercising power under Section
145 Cr.P.C., issued notice for appointment of receiver with respect to the
land in dispute between the parties under Section 146 Cr.P.C. Challenge
has also been raised to order dated 6.7.2011 (Annexure P-3), whereby
the Sub Divisional Magistrate, Barnala, while exercising powers under
Section 146(1) Cr.P.C., attached the land and appointed the Tehsildar
Barnala as receiver with respect to the land in question.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has fairly conceded that
the parties are in their respective possession of land and civil suit is
pending between them.

Taking into consideration the fact that proceedings under
Section 145/146 Cr.P.C. are summary in nature as well as civil suit is

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pending between the parties, no further indulgence of this Court is required and present petitions are disposed of as such.
