Prayer in this petition filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C. is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.403 dated 21.6.2015 under Sections 420, 406 and 506 IPC registered at Police Station Nuh, District Mewat.

This Court vide order dated 3.8.2015 has granted interim bail to the petitioner subject to the satisfaction of the arresting/investigating officer and the petitioner was directed to join the investigation as and when called upon to do so and shall remain bound by the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that in pursuance of

the aforesaid order, the petitioner has joined the investigation.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Bhagwat Parsad states that though the petitioner has joined the investigation but he is not cooperating as the recovery has not been effected from him and he is avoiding to make the payment.

Learned counsel for the complainant submits that an amount of Rs.5,69,850/- is required to be recovered from the petitioner as the complainant has supplied bricks and despite there being assurance from the petitioner, he has not paid the amount.

Heard.

Considering the fact that the petitioner has joined the investigation, and so far as recovery part is concerned, that is yet to be established during the trial, the present petition is allowed and the interim bail granted by this Court to the petitioner vide order dated 3.8.2015 is made absolute.

However, if required, the petitioner shall continue to join investigation as and when required to do so and shall abide by the terms and conditions, as laid down under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.
