Report dated 27.08.2015 of learned Civil Judge (Jr. Divn.)-
cum-Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, Malerkotla has been received
whereby after recording statements of complainant Jagdish Singh,
injured Surinder Singh as well as the accused persons namely
Jatinder Singh, Dilshad Singh, Harpreet Singh, Jagtar Singh, Gurinder
Singh, Balwinder Singh, Parsan Singh, Narinder Kaur and Kuldeep
Kaur, the Court has shown its satisfaction that the compromise has

been arrived at voluntarily, out of free will of the parties, without any undue influence, coercion or pressure.

Heard.

In the light of the satisfaction shown by the Court and the offences for which the accused have been hauled up are not of serious nature, together with the fact that compromise will go a long way in ironing out differences for betterment of future life of the parties and in view of the law laid down in '**Gian Singh v. State of Punjab and another**' 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and '**Kulwinder Singh and others v. State of Punjab and another**' 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of FIR No.178 dated 30.12.2009 registered at Police Station Sadar Malerkotla, District Sangrur under Sections 447/511/427/506/148/149 IPC and all consequences arising out of the said FIR qua the petitioners are quashed.

The petition stands allowed in those terms.
