Report dated 28.09.2015 of learned Judicial Magistrate 1st

Class, Amritsar has been received whereby after recording statements of complainant Shalini Verma and the accused persons namely Ashwani Kumar, Devi Ditta, Kanta Rani alias Kanta, Kamal Kishore alias Kamal Kumar and Deepak Verma alias Deepak Kumar, the Court has shown its satisfaction that the compromise has been arrived at voluntarily, out of free will of the parties, without any undue influence, coercion or pressure.

Heard.

In the light of the satisfaction shown by the Court, being a pure matrimonial dispute together with the fact that compromise will go a long way in ironing out differences for betterment of future life of the parties and in view of the law laid down in '**Gian Singh v. State of Punjab and another**' 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and '**Kulwinder Singh and others v. State of Punjab and another**' 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of FIR No.172 dated 22.12.2014 registered at Police Station Majitha, Amritsar Rural under Sections 498A/406/149 IPC and all consequences arising out of the said FIR are quashed.

The petition stands allowed in those terms.
