SHEKHER DHAWAN, J (ORAL)

Present petition has been filed by petitioner under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for issuance of directions to respondents No.3 and 4 to protect the personal liberty and property of the petitioner.

2. As per petitioner, he wanted to go abroad in contract with private respondents who assured them to send him to Canada and demanded ₹18,00,000/- in all. Petitioner fell in their trap and paid ₹11,00,000/- on different dates. Later on respondents executed compromise with the petitioner and agreed to return the principle amount of ₹11,00,000/- with interest and a part payment of ₹3,00,000/- was made in pursuance of the compromise. Thereafter, respondents resiled from their statement. Petitioner is suffering at the hands of private respondents. Now the life of the petitioner is in danger, at the hands of respondent as they are influential persons. Petitioner knocked at the door of police authorities for justice and there is complete inaction on the part of official respondents and as such official respondents No.3 to 4 be issued directions to protect the life,

personal liberty and property of the petitioner.

3. As the claim of the petitioner is mainly based upon financial dealings and recovery of amount on the basis of alleged compromise. No case is made out for issuance of directions to official respondents No.3 and

4. However, if at later stage petitioner considers any genuine threat to his life or property, he shall be well within his rights to approach the official respondents for appropriate legal action if any.

4. In view of the above, present petition being without any merit stands dismissed.
