FATEH DEEP SINGH, J. (ORAL)

Report dated 01.10.2014 of learned Judicial Magistrate 1st

Class, Rajpura has been received whereby after recording statements of complainant Jogwinder Singh and the accused persons namely Darshan Singh, Dalbir Singh, Gurdeep Singh, Gursewak Singh and Rupinder Singh @ Mithu, the Court has shown its satisfaction that the compromise has been arrived at voluntarily, out of free will of the parties, without any undue influence, coercion or pressure.

Heard.

In the light of the satisfaction shown by the Court and the fact that offences are not of heinous nature and the parties belong to the same very village coupled with the fact that compromise will go a long way in resolving the personal dispute and in bringing about peace, amity and harmony for the future welfare of the parties and conducive atmosphere, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of FIR No.49 dated 04.07.2012 registered at Police Station Kheri Gandian, Distt. Patiala under Sections 336, 323, 506, 148, 149 IPC and all consequences arising thereof are quashed.

The petition stands allowed in those terms.
