AJAY TEWARI, J. (Oral)

This is a petition for anticipatory bail filed in case bearing FIR No. 18 dated 09.03.2014, under Sections 419/420/467/468/120-B IPC , registered at Police Station Gidderbaha, District Sri Muktsar Sahib.

On 12.08.2014 the following order was passed:-

“ Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petition who is 85 years of age is said to be an attesting witness of the sale deed in question.

Notice of motion to Advocate General, Punjab for 3.11.2014.

In the meantime, the petitioner shall appear before the Investigating Officer on 19.8.,2014 at 11.00 a.m. and join the investigation. In the event of his arrest, he be admitted to interim bail by the Investigating Officer/Arresting Officer to his satisfaction. He shall, however, abide by all the conditions as envisaged by Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Today learned Addl.AG has stated that the petitioner has joined the investigation and is not required for custodial interrogation.

Consequently the petition is allowed. In the event of his arrest the petitioner shall be released on bail by the investigating officer to his satisfaction subject to the compliance of the provisions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Since the main case has been decided, the Criminal Misc.Application, if any also stands disposed of.
