Quashing of the FIR No.54 dated 23.05.2014 under Sections 406, 420, 120-B of IPC, registered at Police Station Amloh, District Fatehgarh Sahib (Annexure P-1) and its consequential proceedings on the basis of compromise dated 24.07.2014 (Annexure P-2), is being sought.

The dispute between the complainant and the petitioners was with regard to payment of Rs.6 lacs. The complainant is a real sister of petitioner No.1 and her allegation is that the petitioners wanted to get execute the registry of their land in their favour and on 08.05.2013 and Rs.4 lacs have been paid to the petitioners by the complainant and Rs.1,95,000/- on 10.05.2013. This amount was not returned and in this background the FIR was registered.

During the pendency of the investigation itself, the matter has been compromised by the parties.

In compliance of the order dated 08.08.2014, status report has been received from the Chief Judicial Magistrate, Fatehgarh Sahib and the

statements of the parties have been recorded to the effect that they have compromised the matter and the present FIR may be quashed qua the present petitioners.

Consequently, in view of the status report and in view of the judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the case of **Madan Mohan Abbot vs. State of Punjab 2008(2) RCR (Criminal) 429**, the law laid down by the Full Bench of this Court in the case of **Kulwinder Singh and Ors. vs. State of Punjab and another 2007(3) RCR (Crl.) 1052**, no useful purpose would be served in prolonging the litigation.

Accordingly, FIR No.54 dated 23.05.2014 under Sections 406, 420, 120-B of IPC, registered at Police Station Amloh, District Fatehgarh Sahib (Annexure P-1), is quashed with all consequential proceedings arising therefrom qua petitioners.

The petition stands disposed of qua petitioners.
