Petitioner, by way of present petition under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure ('Cr.P.C.' for short), seeks appropriate directions to the respondents not to harass the petitioner or implicate her in any false case and if at all, any case is to be registered against her, the same may be done only after getting the consent of senior police officer of the rank of Director General of Police with further prayer that seven days' notice be given to her, if at all, she is to be summoned/arrested in any case.

Notice of motion was issued and pursuant thereto, reply was filed on behalf of respondent-State.

Learned counsel for the State submits that in another petition i.e. CRM-M-25681-2014 filed by the petitioner, since FIR has been registered, the present petition has also been rendered infructuous and the same may be disposed of, as such.

Faced with the above, learned counsel for the petitioner also fairly states that let the present petition be disposed of but liberty may be granted to the petitioner to pursue her remedy, in accordance with law, as and when necessity arises.

In view of the above, instant petition is disposed of, as having been rendered infructuous, with liberty as prayed for.

Disposed of, accordingly.
