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**DAYA CHAUDHARY, J. (ORAL)**

Petitioners, namely, Gurdeep Singh, Babloo, Manpreet Singh and Gurmeet Singh @ Kala have approached this Court by way of filing the present petition for quashing of FIR No.172 dated 13.11.2011 registered under Sections 323/324/452/506 IPC at Police Station Industrial Area, Saha, Tehsil and District Ambala.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that during pendency of the present petition, a compromise has been arrived at between the parties, which is annexed as Annexure P-2 with the petition.

In pursuance of directions issued by this Court on 29.10.2014, the statements of the parties were recorded before the trial Court and after recording their statements, a report has also been sent by Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Ambala, wherein, the factum of compromise has been affirmed. It has also been stated in the report that no other case, except the

present FIR, is pending against the petitioners and no P.O proceedings are also pending against them.

The petitioners as well as the complainant in their statements have stated that the compromise between them is as per their free will and without any pressure from either side. Complainant/respondent No.2- Pritpal Singh has also stated that he has no objection in quashing of the FIR as well as other proceedings arising therefrom.

In view of ratio of law laid down by a larger Bench of this Court in a judgment rendered in **Kulwinder Singh vs State of Punjab 2007(3) RCR Criminal 1052**, even the proceedings can be quashed where the offence is non-compoundable.

In the present case, the complainant/respondent No.2/injured has no objection in quashing of FIR, in question, as well as subsequent proceedings arising therefrom.

Accordingly, this petition is allowed and FIR No.172 dated 13.11.2011 registered under Sections 323/324/452/506 IPC at Police Station Industrial Area, Saha, Tehsil and District Ambala, Haryana along with all consequential proceedings arising therefrom, qua petitioners Gurdeep Singh, Babloo, Manpreet Singh and Gurmeet Singh @ Kala are hereby quashed.
