Learned State counsel seeks to place on record additional affidavit of Mr.Sukhchain Singh Gill, Senior Superintendent of Police, U.T., Chandigarh. Para Nos. 2 & 3 thereof reads as under:-

“That as already submitted earlier in order to control the offences relating to the immoral trafficking the Chandigarh Administration has already constituted a Non-Official Advisory Body under the Prevention of Immoral Trafficking Act 1956 and the Sub Divisional Police Officer (SDPO) of each division and DSP crime have been directed to take all steps to control the aforementioned offences.

That the term of the aforementioned Non Official Advisory Body is going to expire on 23.12.2015 and already the reports has been asked for, from all the sub divisional police officer, with respect to the above body. Most of the reports have been received and the non official body is likely to be reconstituted. Apart from it, the police has been directed to regularly check all the Hotels, Bus stop,

Dharamshalas etc to prevent the occurrence of such offences.”

Learned counsel for U.T assures the court that all steps shall be taken to curb such type of crime under the Prevention of Immoral Trafficking Act 1956.

In view of above, no further direction in the matter is necessary at this stage. U.T. Administration shall take steps in accordance with affidavit submitted before this court.

Petitioner was granted interim bail vide order dated 22.9.2015. According to counsel for the petitioner, petitioner is facing trial and is regularly appearing before the trial court. This contention is not controverted by counsel for U.T., Chandigarh.

In view of above, interim order dated 22.9.2015 is hereby made absolute, subject to satisfaction of trial court.

Petition stands allowed in aforesaid terms.
