Petitioner has filed the instant petition for quashing of the impugned FIR on the basis of compromise. However, learned counsel for respondent No.2-complainant, while referring to the averments taken in the reply filed on behalf of respondent No.2, submits that no compromise, as a matter of fact, has taken place between the parties.

In view of the above, instant petition would not survive as it is. Accordingly, present petition is disposed of, however, liberty is granted to the petitioner to file a fresh petition on the same cause of action, as and when necessity arises.
