This order will dispose of two instant petitions bearing
CRM-M-27906-2014 titled as Swaranjit Singh & others vs. State of
Punjab & another and CRM-M-8558-2015 titled as Vipin Kumar vs.
State of Punjab & another for quashing of FIR No.100 dated
01.05.2012 registered under Sections 420, 465, 467, 468, 471, 474,

120-B IPC, Police Station Phase-I, Mohali, District SAS Nagar and the consequent proceedings arising out of the same, on the basis of written compromise arrived at between the parties.

Reports have been received from the trial Court after statements of the parties were recorded regarding the compromise. The trial Court has reported that the compromise is voluntary and without any pressure or coercion. The trial Court has also sent copy of the statements of parties and the compromise.

Learned counsel for the State on instructions submits that petitioners are the only accused and respondent No.2 is the only aggrieved person in this FIR.

No useful purpose would be served to keep the FIR pending.

In view of the statements and report of the trial Court and the principles laid down by the Full Bench judgment of this Court in **Kulwinder Singh and others Vs. State of Punjab and another, 2007(3) RCR (Criminal) 1052**, approved by Hon'ble Apex Court in **Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and others (2012) 10 SCC 303**, the instant petitions are allowed and the aforesaid FIR and all consequent proceedings conducted on the basis thereof are quashed.

Needless to say that parties shall remain bound by the terms of compromise and their statements made in the Court below.
