SNEH PRASHAR, J.

The instant petition under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure (for short 'Cr.P.C.') has been filed by the petitioners seeking quashing of First Information Report No.63 dated 25.02.2014 (Annexure P-1) registered under Sections 452, 323, 34 of the Indian Penal Code at Police Station Kapurthala City, District Kapurthala and all consequential proceedings arising therefrom, on the ground of compromise (Annexure P-2) arrived at between the parties.

In pursuance of the order dated 27.1.2015 passed by this Court, the learned Chief Judicial Magistrate, Kapurthala has sent his report with regard to the genuineness of the compromise Annexure P-1.

In his report, the learned Chief Judicial Magistrate has reported that the compromise between the complainant and the accused seems to be genuine and without any pressure or coercion. Copies of the statements of the parties are attached with the report.

Learned counsel appearing for respondent No.2-complainant has conceded the factum of compromise and submitted that the complainant has no objection, if the First Information Report in question is quashed.

In view of the above, this Court is of the opinion that no useful purpose would be served in continuing the proceedings. In view of the law laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and others, (2012)10 SCC 303**, the Court is competent to quash the proceedings on the basis of compromise. Accordingly, this petition is allowed and First Information Report No.63 dated 25.02.2014(Annexure P-1) registered under Sections 452, 323, 34 of the Indian Penal Code at Police Station Kapurthala City, District Kapurthala and all consequential proceedings arising therefrom are hereby quashed qua the petitioners.
