This order shall dispose of aforesaid two petitions i.e CRM No. M-28653 of 2014 filed by Harshpreet Singh @ Lalli and CRM No. M-29517 of 2014 filed by Karamjit Singh & others.

CRM No. M-28653 of 2014 has been filed under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for quashing of FIR No.230 dated 11.12.2009 under Sections 452, 325, 427, 148 and 149 of the Indian Penal Code, registered at Police Station Sarabha Nagar, Ludhiana, on the basis of compromise (Annexure P-2), along with all subsequent proceedings arising from that FIR.

CRM No. M-29517 of 2014 has been filed under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for quashing of cross-version bearing DDR No. 20 dated 17.12.2009 registered under Sections 324, 323, 427 and 34 of the Indian Penal Code registered at Police Station Sarabha Nagar, Ludhiana in FIR No.230 dated 11.12.2009 under Sections 452, 325, 427, 148 and 149 of the Indian Penal Code, registered at Police Station Sarabha Nagar, Ludhiana, on the basis of compromise (Annexure P-2), along with all subsequent proceedings arising from that FIR.

Report of learned trial Court has been received, in which, it has been categorically observed that compromise is outcome of free-will and volition of aggrieved parties and without any coercion or pressure. Even otherwise, the matter involved is personal in nature, which has been amicably put at rest.

It is pretty settled that compromise is the soul of justice, which not only enhances the social amity, harmony and peace but also reduces friction and discord.

In view of the above I am of the considered opinion that continuation of criminal proceedings between the parties would be an abuse of the process of law and the present compromise is for their benefit and will bring peace and harmony between them.

Consequently, both the petitions are allowed and FIR No.230 dated 11.12.2009 under Sections 452, 325, 427, 148 and 149 of the Indian Penal Code, registered at Police Station Sarabha Nagar, Ludhiana and all other consequential proceedings arising therefrom including cross-version recorded as DDR No. 20 dated 17.12.2009 under Sections 324, 323, 427 and 34 of the Indian Penal Code registered at Police Station Sarabha Nagar, Ludhiana are quashed qua the petitioner(s).
